Once again our church family truly stepped up and helped make our latest Christ Care Breakfast a great success! After expenses were paid we found ourselves just **\$279.37** short of our **\$4000 goal!** Isn't that wonderful? Unfortunately, our ever-so-efficient bookkeeper, Erica, reminded us that since the table company is in Utah we will still be needing to pay Idaho sales tax, an additional **\$241.51**, when tax season rolls around in April. That still leaves us only a **little over \$500 away** from the final goal. We are confidently moving ahead with this project and ordering the tables soon! So the next question is...**what do we do with all of the old tables?**

Our Session members decided that we would give the tables away (yes...free!) to members of our church family. It didn't seem right

to ask you to donate money for new tables and then charge you to take away the old tables too! We only ask that you actually take the tables of which you have a purpose and not use them for resale. On **Sunday, November 13th**, the tables will be set up in the Family Center. Please come that morning anytime after 8:45 to select the table(s) you would like. Look the tables over and with tape we will label your choice(s). You may either haul them that day after church or come by the church during office hours the following week to pick up your selection. Remember, the tables are large and they are heavy. The round tables are 60" across and the long tables are 96"x30".
